



## Re-entry Timeline and Services 2025

### Reception into Prison

- Prison classification based on security and program needs
- COMPAS Risk and Needs Assessment
- Educational assessments
- Mental health assessments
- Obtain birth certificates
- Child support enforcement notification
- Medicaid enrollment

**Stage 1**

### Multiple Life/Years to 2 years before Release

- Prison assignment per security and treatment needs; prison security levels ranging from 1 (min.) to 5 (max.)
- Program case plan developed
- GED/high school diploma
- Career and technical education classes
- College- Prison work (skilled, unskilled) certificates
- Annual Reviews: prison security level, program needs, updated case plans, re-entry housing plans
- Mental health services
- Faith based programs
- Family engagement, visiting, parenting classes
- Re-entry savings account- payments on fines, restitution
- Veterans programming/housing
- Substance use disorder treatment
- Sex offender treatment

**Stage 2**

### 24 Months before Release

- Transfer to facility closest to home
- Intensive re-entry program assignments
- Life skills/money management courses
- Evidence-based programs continue
- Education and work programs continue
- Housing needs confirmed

**Stage 3**

### 6 Months before Release

- Re-entry programs continue; placement in Intensive Re-entry Program and Re-entry Triage Center for eligible inmates
- Medicaid enrollment if not previously completed
- Housing plan confirmed by probation officer in-person
- If no home plan exists, arrangements for housing in community residential programs or temporary emergency housing
- Inmates without viable plans are referred to DOC's Community Release Unit
- Re-entry probation officers meets with inmates in prison and holds seminars on probation success
- Family reunification seminars
- Substance use disorder and mental health post release appointments established for continuum of care to include medication assisted treatment
- Identity documents obtained (DMV ID cards and social security cards)
- Drive to work seminars
- Workforce readiness programs
- Community resource referrals such as discounted phones
- Job interview coaching
- Applications for benefits (veteran disability, social security disability)
- Work release
- Bonding eligibility letter issued
- Restoration of rights application
- Sex offender registration

**Stage 4**

### Post Release Probation/Parole

- COMPAS Risk and Needs Assessment to determine supervision level and services needed
- On-going referrals to community resources, employment and social services
- Home visits by probation officer/family contacts
- Provision of or referrals to: mental health services, substance use disorder, sex offender programming, transition from prison groups, peer support groups, Victim Empathy Program
- As needed, referrals for housing: new home plans by individual, community residential programs, temporary emergency housing, and community corrections alternative programs
- Local re-entry council support
- Restoration of rights application
- Sex offender registration monitored

**Stage 5**

*Note: Re-entry begins at first contact, so the length of time it takes to reach stage five depends on an inmate's length of sentence.*
