| <b>Reception into Prison</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Prison classification based on security and program needs</li><li>- COMPAS Risk and Needs Assessment</li><li>- Educational assessments</li><li>- Mental health assessments</li></ul>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Obtain birth certificates</li><li>- Child support enforcement notification</li><li>- Medicaid enrollment</li></ul>   | <br><b>Stage 1</b>   |
| <b>Multiple Life/Years to 2 years before Release</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Prison assignment per security and treatment needs; prison security levels ranging from 1 (min.) to 5 (max.)</li><li>- Program case plan developed</li><li>- GED/high school diploma</li><li>- Career and technical education classes</li><li>- College- Prison work (skilled, unskilled) certificates</li><li>- Annual Reviews: prison security level, program needs, updated case plans, re-entry housing plans</li></ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Mental health services</li><li>- Faith based programs</li><li>- Family engagement, visiting, parenting classes</li><li>- Re-entry savings account- payments on fines, restitution</li><li>- Veterans programming/housing</li><li>- Substance use disorder treatment</li><li>- Sex offender treatment</li></ul>   | <br><b>Stage 2</b>   |
| <b>24 Months before Release</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Transfer to facility closest to home</li><li>- Intensive re-entry program assignments</li><li>- Life skills/money management courses</li></ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Evidence-based programs continue</li><li>- Education and work programs continue</li><li>- Housing needs confirmed</li></ul>  | <br><b>Stage 3</b>   |
| <b>6 Months before Release</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Re-entry programs continue; placement in Intensive Re-entry Program and Re-entry Triage Center for eligible inmates</li><li>- Medicaid enrollment if not previously completed</li><li>- Housing plan confirmed by probation officer in-person</li><li>- If no home plan exists, arrangements for housing in community residential programs or temporary emergency housing</li><li>- Inmates without viable plans are referred to DOC's Community Release Unit</li><li>- Re-entry probation officers meets with inmates in prison and holds seminars on probation success</li><li>- Family reunification seminars</li><li>- Substance use disorder and mental health post release appointments established for continuum of care to include medication assisted treatment</li></ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Identity documents obtained (DMV ID cards and social security cards)</li><li>- Drive to work seminars</li><li>- Workforce readiness programs</li><li>- Community resource referrals such as discounted phones</li><li>- Job interview coaching</li><li>- Applications for benefits (veteran disability, social security disability)</li><li>- Work release</li><li>- Bonding eligibility letter issued</li><li>- Restoration of rights application</li><li>- Sex offender registration</li></ul> | <br><b>Stage 4</b> |
| <b>Post Release Probation/Parole</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- COMPAS Risk and Needs Assessment to determine supervision level and services needed</li><li>- On-going referrals to community resources, employment and social services</li><li>- Home visits by probation officer/family contacts</li><li>- Provision of or referrals to: mental health services, substance use disorder, sex offender programming, transition from prison groups, peer support groups, Victim Empathy Program</li></ul>  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- As needed, referrals for housing: new home plans by individual, community residential programs, temporary emergency housing, and community corrections alternative programs</li><li>- Local re-entry council support</li><li>- Restoration of rights application</li><li>- Sex offender registration monitored</li></ul>   | <br><b>Stage 5</b> |

*Note: Re-entry begins at first contact, so the length of time it takes to reach stage five depends on an inmate's length of sentence.*
